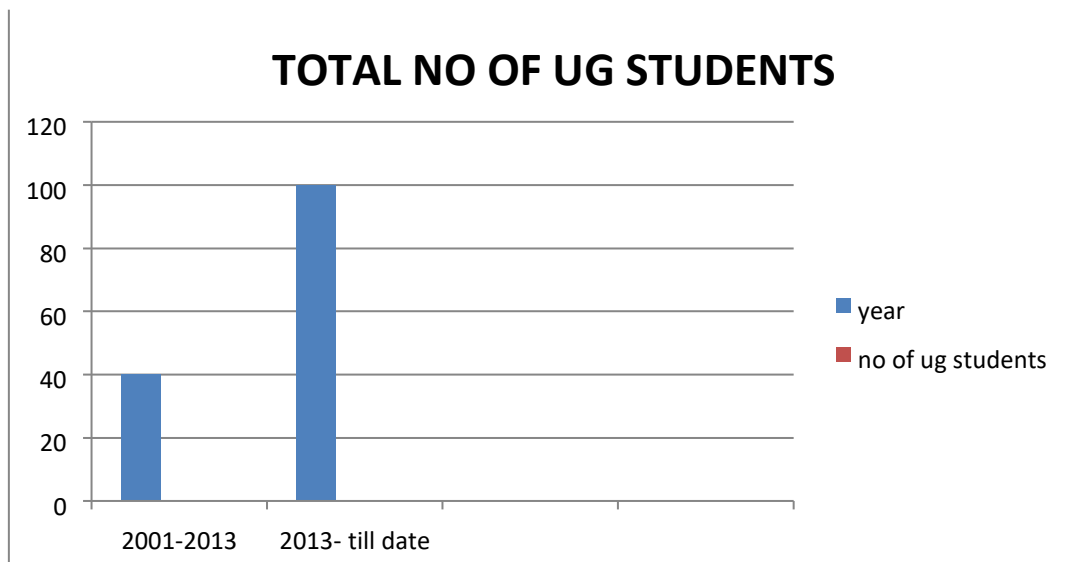


ACHIEVEMENTS WHICH LEAD TO INSTITUTIONAL EXCELLENCE

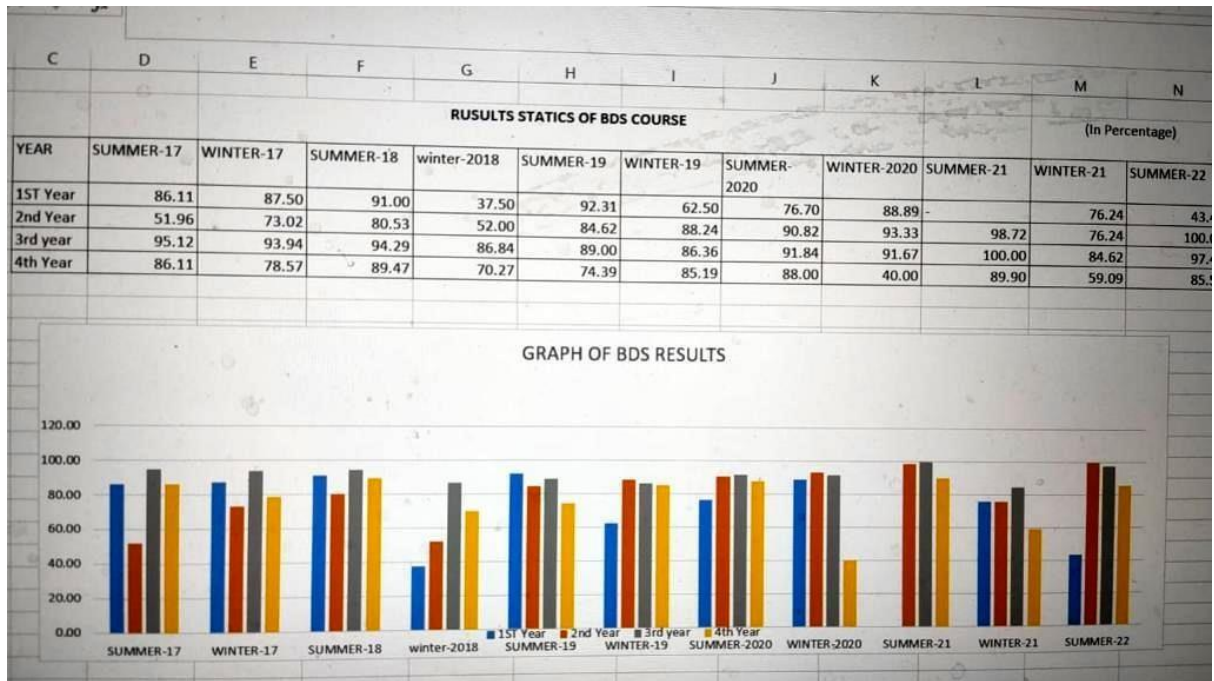

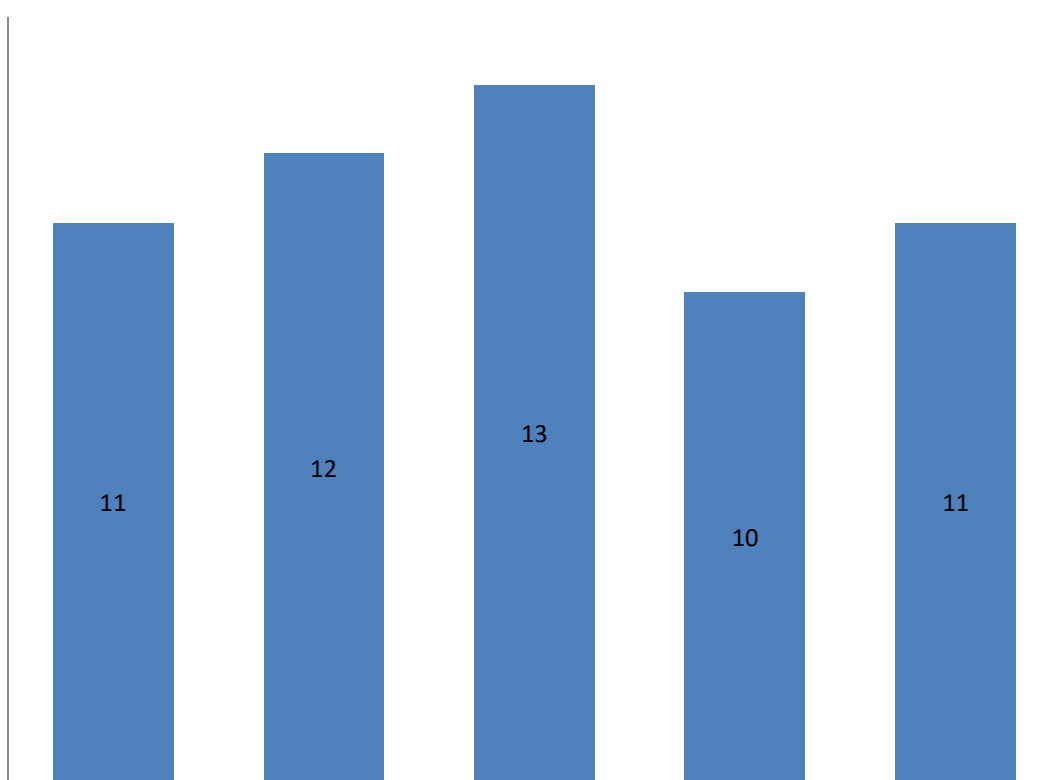
Total number admissions of undergraduate students from:

2. 2013 till date - 100 students/ye

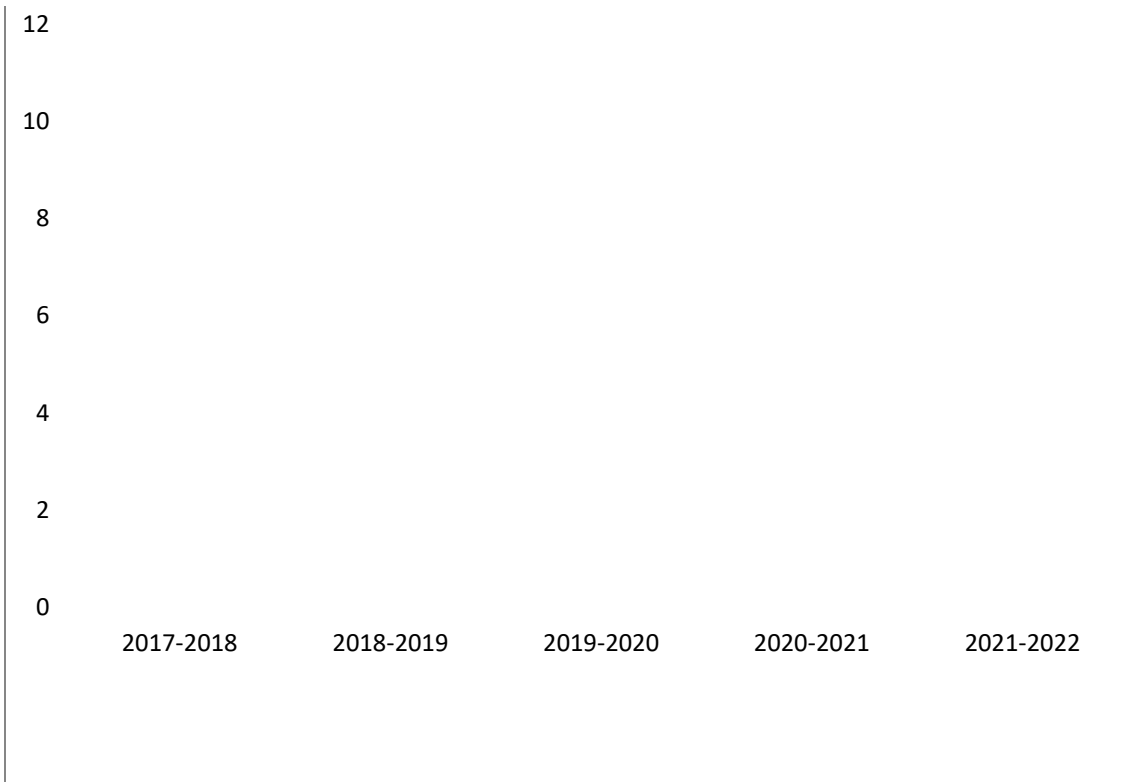
UG RESULT 2021-22 1st YEAR BDS – FINAL YEAR BDS



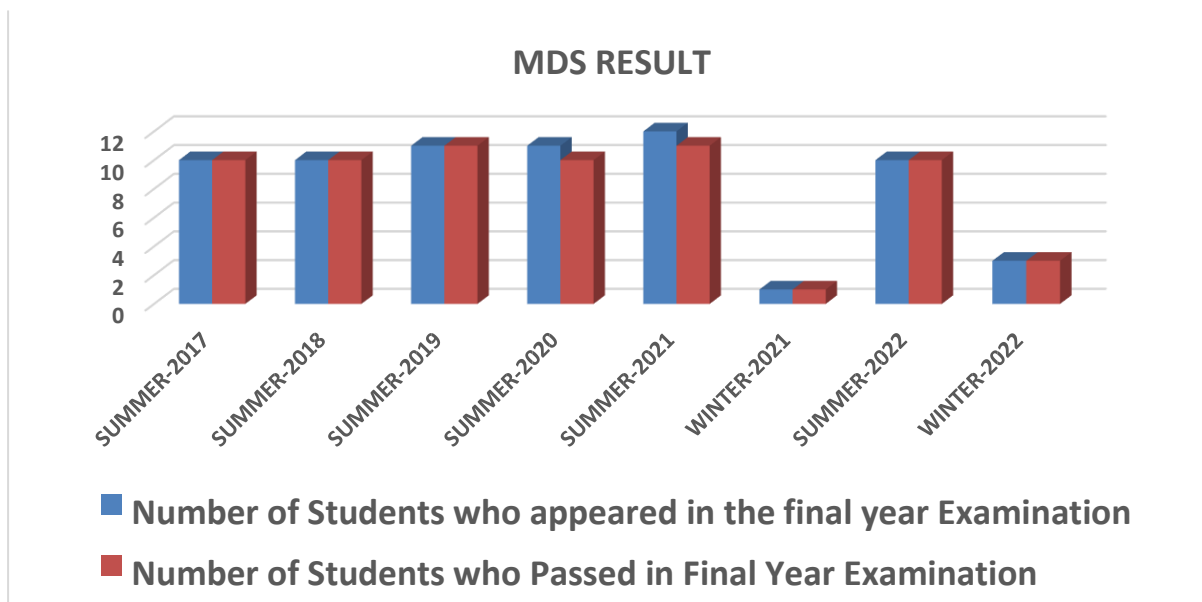
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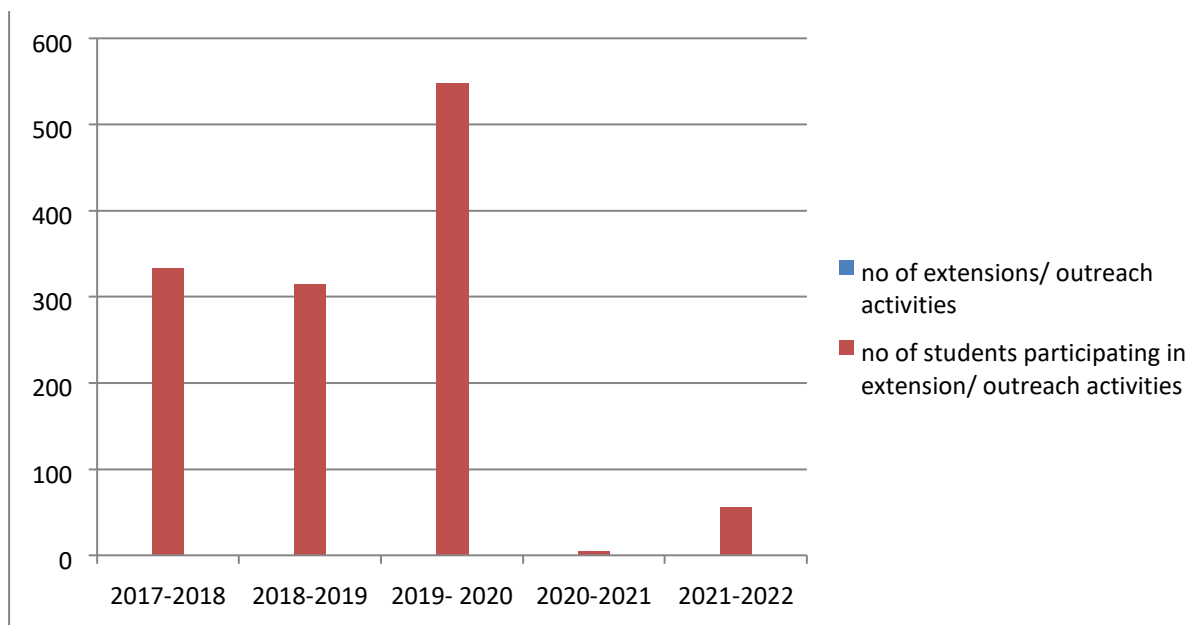
TOTAL NUMBER OF PG STUDENTS PER YEAR

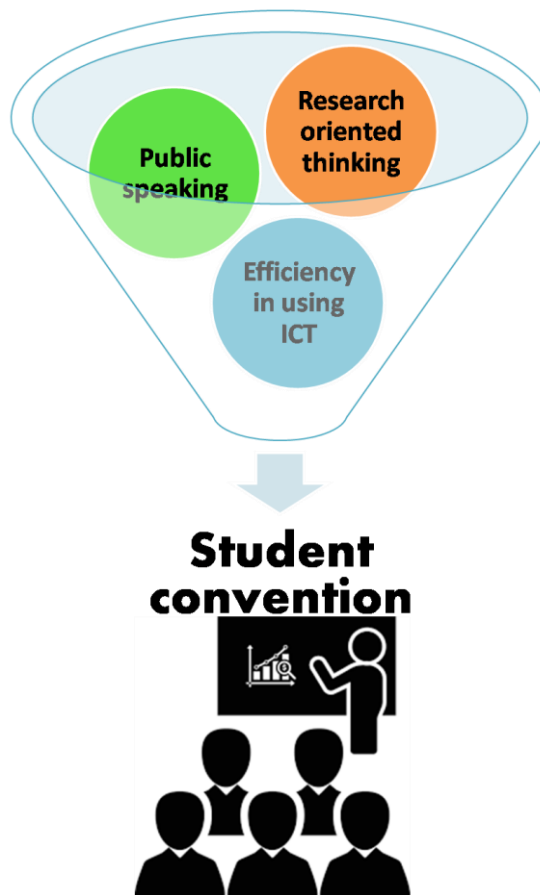

BEST PRACTICES: STRIVING FOR EXCELLENCE

Best Practice 1

Annual undergraduate students convention “Of The Students By The Students For The Students”

OF THE STUDENTS, BY THE STUDENTS, FOR THE STUDENTS



Objectives:

- To help students develop the ability to communicate both within the classroom and in the outside world
- To introduce science-oriented research to students

- To enhance their presentation skills by making and delivering PowerPoint presentations
- To develop skills like self-confidence, time management, bonding with peers and leadership quality
- To gain valuable guidance & feedback from community of scholars
- To help them organize programs Context:

As future dental practitioners, our students must be able to communicate well with patients as well as their peers. At the same time they must have a knack to read and understand the plethora of research that is available for them. This can be achieved by providing them a platform to present a short topic of their interest.

Practice:

Annually we organize an undergraduate student convention **of the students** where all the preparation for the program is done **by the students** under supervision of staff. This student convention provides a platform **for the students** to showcase and enhance their public speaking talent. We allow the students to choose topic of their interest and explore scientific evidence on the same thus developing a critical eye toward the available research. All throughout the process of preparation the students are guided by their chosen teachers.

The presentations are judged on the basis of their ability to captivate the audience, their utilization of PowerPoint skills, ability to explain their topic to the audience, inclusivity of all relevant data and whether they finished the presentation in a timely manner. The audiences who are the students are also benefited by listening to such presentations.

There is quiz competitions at the end which help assess what they have learned in a fun way. The program ends with award ceremony which gives the students a positive affirmation of their hard work and satisfaction that it has been valued by their peers and staff. It also motivates future participation in college convention and also in other institutes

Evidence of success:

- Students are more confident in giving viva voce
- Students have improved in their organizational skills
- Students have participated in various conference organized by other institutes and have won awards there
- Our alumni who are pursuing further studies are more confident in presenting their seminars, journal clubs and papers in conferences

Problems encountered:

- COVID- 19 pandemic retracted the students participation in that year
- There is budget restrictions as we haven't attempted to acquire funding from outside sources
- During the first convention there were some technical issues like power cut and lack of projector screen which we overcame successfully in the later convention
- There are difficulties at present for hosting the annual convention on a larger scale including all the four year students, interns and pgs at one time. Efforts are on for a magnum opus convention in the near future.

Best Practice 2

Out- reach activities “Service Before Self”

SERVICE BEFORE SELF



Objectives:

- To provide basic dental service by reaching out to the rural and vulnerable sections of the society.
- To increase awareness of the necessity and availability of preventive dental care for good oral health
- To provide an opportunity to the students to gain practical experience of what they have learned theoretically
- To instill the quality of ‘service before self ‘in minds of young students

Context:

Our College is located on the outskirts of Solapur city thus surrounded by many small villages. Unfortunately most of the population around here are seen to neglect their oral health due to either lack of awareness or because of lack of time. In this situation, sending our students at their doorstep was an excellent solution which not only benefitted the patients but also helped our students gain experience of this program.

Practice:

The institution conducts free dental camps at rural and sub-urban areas around Solapur. Since 2016, we have organized 165 extension and outreach activities including camps with around 23000 beneficiaries. In collaboration with the Mallawabai Valyal Charitable Trust our institution through the Department of Public Health Dentistry reached out to provide their services in oral health care to a large number of people. The students on rotation basis under the guidance of staff reached out to patients in rural and semi urban areas by holding diagnostic and treatment camps at schools, villages in coordination with the gram panchayats, industries, at the city jail, colleges etc. In association with Colgate India they had school camps where they distributed free toothpastes and brushes to children. Denture delivery camps along with dental checkups were carried out for the geriatric patients at Akkalkot and Pandharpur. Camps were also hosted in collaboration with MUHS, Nashik. The department of Pedodontics & Preventive Dentistry also organises various camps for the benefit and dental health education of school children.

Our PG students and staff also stepped forward as “CORONA WARRIORS” and worked as swab collectors, in patient care etc during the grave pandemic

The institute has established one satellite clinic in Solapur city at Saat Rasta. Interns posted in the Department of Public Health Dentistry and Oral Pathology Department have elective posting at the satellite center on regular basis. The department also has well equipped Mobile Dental Unit which serves as means to provide services in inaccessible areas.

Our college also organizes rallies, cyclothons to increase awareness of dental health among masses on the special days like AIDS Day, Oral Health Day, World No Tobacco Day, etc.

Evidence of success:

- On behalf of the institution, the Dept. of Public Health Dentistry has received various appreciation letters from respective camps and letters of commendation for the excellent services rendered as well as hoping that such programs will be held in future as well.
- Student’s response suggests that they enjoy going to camp as they get confidence to communicate with patients and learn from the work they do there.
- It gives our students a glimpse of the respect and adulation which will be showered on them as practicing dentist in the near future.

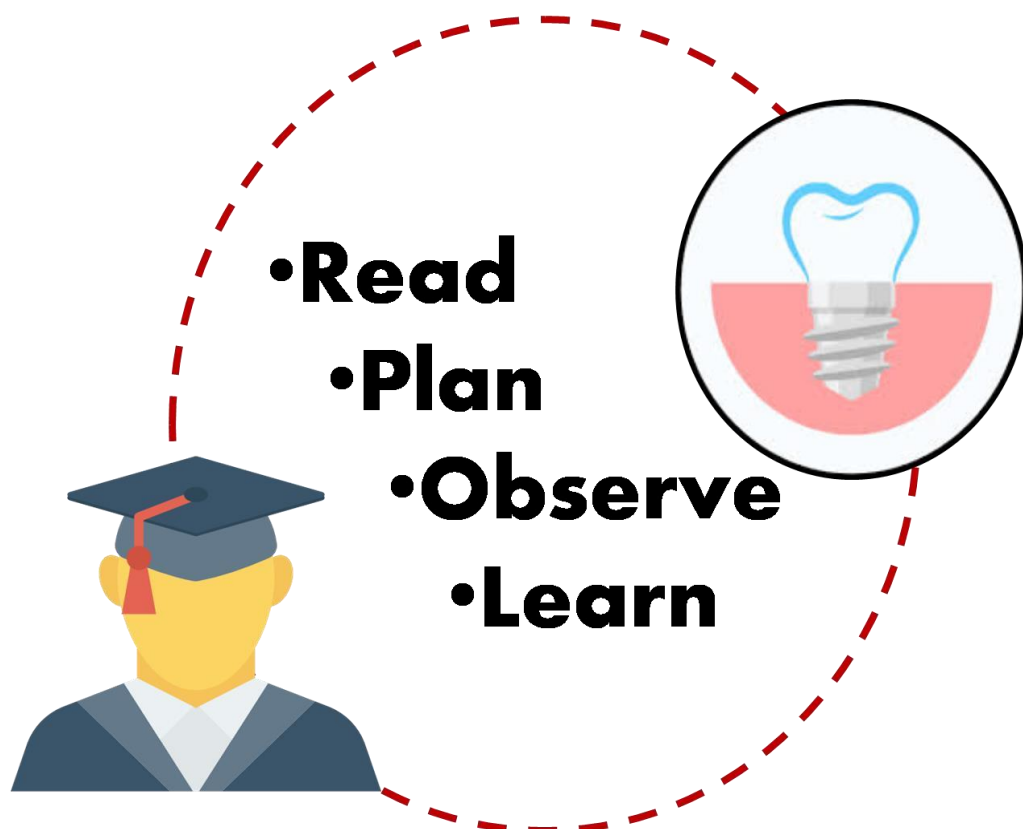
Problems encountered:

- During pandemic, outreach programs took a backseat over more pressing issues
- Not all patients revert back to college despite of the fact that college provides van on request for a group of patients to commute.
- Complete rehabilitation of patients at their doorstep is a goal yet to be achieved

Best Practice 3

“Interning in Implant” programme

INTERNING IN IMPLANTS



Objectives:

- To provide basic understanding of Oral Implantology for interns
- To guide the interns in patient selection, treatment planning and execution of implant placement.
- To help them learn through the experience of experts while handling any difficult case or any unforeseen complications
- To inspire the students to place implants in their practice and acquire further training in this field.

Context:

In recent years, the trend in replacing missing teeth has shifted towards use of implants. However, the current curriculum doesn't include this crucial aspect and hence the students remain devoid of knowledge regarding same. Hence this program is planned wherein the students receive basic knowledge of implants and are ready to explore this field in future. This curriculum was designed to include all the "must know" and "better to know" perspectives and carefully avoiding exhaustive details.

Practice: Every year the intern batch is given education about dental implants through this program. Simplified lectures regarding the basics of implant dentistry are taken which explains the parts of implants, Anatomy, Bone biology, Surgical principles, Radiology, Prosthodontics and Periodontics with regard to implant dentistry. 6-8 interns are allotted to one case and they observed the case from planning to rehabilitation. They manage the preoperative planning and preparation required for that case. On the day of the procedure they observe the various steps in implant placement live. They are thoroughly explained the procedure and are given opportunity to ask questions to the staff. Both Department of Prosthodontics and Periodontics are actively involved in this program

Evidence of success:

- Our alumni have reported that this program has helped them in understanding and placing implants
- The numbers of implant patients have increased because of the involvement of interns in the process.

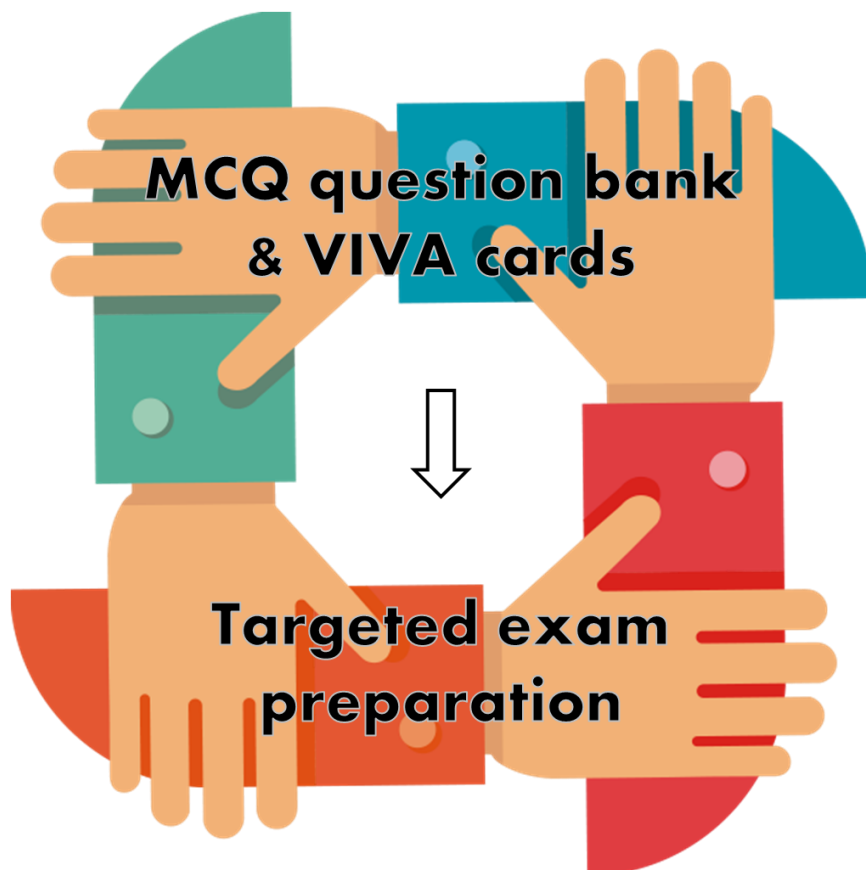
Problems encountered:

- There is difficulty in integrating students in actually placing the implant due to time constraint
- The number of intern per case is high

Best Practice 4

MCQs and Viva Cards “Join Forces Ace Your Courses”

JOIN FORCES, ACE YOUR COURSES



Objectives:

- To collect study material by joining forces for final BDS as well as for entrance examination preparation

- To direct the students for post graduation preparation in a more focused manner
- To revise the theory while preparing the study material which will help in their clinical work
- To form a data bank of questions in each department beneficial to undergraduates, interns as well as staff for preparing question papers and taking viva
- To reduce bias between questions asked by internal and external examiners during undergraduate examination.

Context:

Considering the vastness of each subject and the amount of questions that can be asked per topic the students get overwhelmed while preparing for exams. Thus to help them through this process this program has been initiated. A question bank of multiple choice questions (MCQ) and viva cards are provided to students. MCQ are simple and effective way to assess learning and viva cards help them focus on their study material. Who best to prepare these questions than the freshly passed out interns who are familiar with the study material and the difficulties that come along with it.

Practice:

This is a two part program

As a part of departmental submission, interns are asked to formulate and submit a set of 20 MCQ's each for any given topic under the guidance of staff. This data is then compiled to form question banks on different topics in each department.

The said question bank is used by Undergraduate students posted in the department for revision purposes, by interns for entrance exam (NEET, NBDE) preparation as well as by faculty for setting question papers. Interns are also asked to prepare 10 viva questions of a particular topic each covering most of the Undergraduate syllabus. These questions are then assorted by the staff of that department to prepare viva cards. Each card contains questions covering the entire syllabus and are distributed in 3 levels based on their difficulty (must know-5 questions, should know-3

questions and nice to know-2 questions). Each department has 50 such cards minimum.

The viva cards are of great help to both students and faculty for bringing about a balance in the number of questions asked as well as enabling them to cover the entire portion in the viva.

Evidence of success:

- The number of students using the MCQ question bank is increasing
- The number of students getting admission for MDS have increased
- The students have reported that their examination pattern is fair due to the viva cards
- Faculties have given feedback that both MCQ question bank and viva cards have been helpful to them during conducting exams.
- Better marks in MCQs in exams Problems encountered:
 - Whole hearted participation of all interns not seen. The students who sincerely wanted to go on for higher education were more interested and positive about the program
 - Assorting the questions was a tedious process
 - Resources were not a problem since the students had to find and write their own MCQs from available textbooks and university question papers.
 - Also cost of lamination of viva cards was quite reasonable.
